Noah's Ark

Home Huddle Storytime and Questions

Read together the story of Noah's Ark in your Spark Story Bible found on page 20. Once done reading, ask: Why did Noah build an ark? What did Noah put on the ark? What is your favorite animal? For how many days did it rain? What did God put in the sky?

Let's Do Some Art!

Materials Included: Noah's Ark sticker sheet and Ark paper, 2 Spinning wheels sheet, piece of cardstock, 2 pieces of string

Materials From Home: Markers, crayons or paints, scissors, cardstock or empty cereal box, glue stick or double sided tape.

What to do: God told Noah to build an Ark. The ark was to save two of each kind of animal and Noah's family from the flood. After 40 days the rain stopped and God put a rainbow in the sky.

First activity- Noah's Ark: Use the stickers and ark paper to make your own ark filled with pairs of animals.

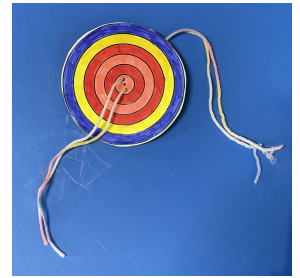
Second activity-Rainbow spinner: Color 2 of the circles. Use crayons, markers or even paint. Cut out the circles. (save the other 2 circles so you can make another one)

- Trace one of the circles onto a piece of cardstock or use an empty cereal box or cracker box etc..
- Apply glue or double stick tape to the cardboard circle, especially around the outer edges.
- Line up the edges and carefully attach **one** of the template circles onto the cardboard.
- Apply glue or tape to the other side of the cardboard. Attach the other paper circle so that the two dots line up with the two dots on the opposite side.



Have an adult perform the next step.

- Use a thumbtack to poke holes where the two dots are marked on the template. Wiggle the thumbtack around to make the hole large enough for the yarn to pass through.
- Poke the yarn through one of the holes in the center of the spinner, using a yarn needle or toothpick. Pull the yarn half way through so there's an equal amount on each side.
- Repeat with the second piece of yarn through the second hole.
- To play with the spinner toy, hold the yarn on either side of the disc. Rotate one or both of your wrists in a fast circular motion, towards your body, to wind up the string.
- Now pull your hands away from each other so the yarn becomes taut. Watch the spinner toy swirl and twirl!
- You can control the speed of the spinner by moving your hands closer together and farther apart.
