

What to Do:

Each day, there is a story to read, a Bible verse to share, a question to answer, a prayer to say, and a magnetic fridge word to make. Use the magnetic clip in your bag to attach this booklet to your fridge so that it is easy to find. Start or finish your day with Jesus. It's as easy as A-B-C.



Wednesday, October 1

L-I-G-H-T

Read: One dark night, Amelia felt scared in her room. Then, she spotted a tiny light glowing from her nightlight. It wasn't big, but it made her feel safe. "I'm here," the little light seemed to say. Lila smiled and snuggled in bed. The next day, she told her friend, "Even a small light can chase away the dark!" From then on, Lila tried to be a light—kind, brave, and bright wherever she went.

Bible Verse: "God's word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path." (Psalm 119:105)

Magnetic Word: On the fridge, find the letters to spell: L-I-G-H-T.

Ask: How can you be a light to someone today?

Prayer: Dear God, help me light up the world with your love. Amen.



Thursday, October 2

H-E-L-P


Read: Lord Bumble was a tiny, kind bee who wore a giant purple hat. One windy day, *whoosh!*—his hat flew away! “Oh dear,” said Lord Bumble, chasing it past the hive, over the pond, and through the flower field. Bible Verse: “Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my righteous right hand.” (Isaiah 41:10)

Magnetic Word: On the fridge, find the letters to spell: H-E-L-P.

Ask: Who can you help today?

Prayer: Dear God, help me so that I can help others. Amen.



Friday, October 3

T-H-A-N-K-S

Read: Gustav made a paper tree for school and wrote something he was thankful for on each leaf. “Mom,” “Dad,” “my dog,” “pizza,” and “sunshine,” he wrote with a smile. Soon, his tree was full! At dinner, he shared it with his family. “Thank you for everything,” he said. His parents hugged him tight. Gustav learned that saying thank you makes people happy—and it helps us see all the good things we already have!

Bible Verse: “Give thanks to the Lord for God is good...” (Psalm 136:105a)

Magnetic Word: On the fridge, find the letters to spell: T-H-A-N-K-S.

Ask: Who can you say “thank you” to today?

Prayer: Dear God, help me be thankful in everything I do. Amen.



Saturday, October 4

W-I-S-H



Bible Verse: “And as you wish that others would do to you, do so to them.” (Luke 6:31)

Magnetic Word: On the fridge, find the letters to spell: W-I-S-H.

Prayer: Dear God, help me to believe in your deep wish for me. Amen.



Sunday, October 5

G-R-O-W

Prayer: Dear God, help me grow in love and care. Amen.



Monday, October 6

Read: In a small town, Julia fell while playing. Tears welled up, but her big brother gently lifted her, and Mom kissed her scraped knee. That night, they laughed over dinner, sharing stories, and hugs. Julia felt safe, loved, and strong. She realized family wasn't just people—it was her shelter, her joy, her team. For every child, family is the first place where love begins and strength quietly grows.

Bible Verse: "Let love be genuine...and hold fast to what is good."
(Romans 12:9)

Magnetic Word: On the fridge, find the letters to spell: F-A-M-I-L-Y.

Ask: How does your family help you? How are you part of God's family?

Prayer: Dear God, help me be good and to love my family. Amen.



Tuesday, October 7

F-A-I-T-H

S-C-A-R-E-D



Bible Verse: "Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven."
(Matthew 5:12a)

Magnetic Word: On the fridge, find the letters to spell: G-L-A-D.

Ask: What makes you glad? What makes you sad?

Prayer: Dear God, help me be glad, always. Amen.



Friday, October 10

L-O-V-E

Read: Aubrey scraped her knee and ran to Mom, who hugged her tight. “I love you,” Mom whispered. At school, her friend shared a cookie, smiling wide. That night, Aubrey prayed, feeling God’s gentle love around her. She realized love comes in many ways—through family, friends, and God, always near.

Bible Verse: “Anyone who does not love does not know God, because God is love.” (1 John 4:8)

Magnetic Word: On the fridge, find the letters to spell: L-O-V-E.

Ask: What does love mean to you? Who loves you? How does God love you?

Prayer: Dear God, help me to love as you have loved me. Amen.



Saturday, October 11

J-O-Y

Read: Audrey danced in the rain, laughter echoing like prayer. Strangers joined—barefoot, soaked, radiant. In their eyes, she saw God, not distant but alive in smiles, in shared delight. P-R-A-I-S-E



Each action shows love and honor to God. Praise isn't just words—it's how we live every day, showing God we're thankful, happy, and full of love!

Bible Verse: The one man who returned to Jesus said, “Thank you, Jesus! Praise God! Thank you!” (Spark Story Bible)

Magnetic Word: On the fridge, find the letters to spell: P-R-A-I-S-E.

Ask: How did you praise God today? How does your family praise God daily?

Prayer: Dear God, help me to praise you in the morning, noon, and night. Amen.



Monday, October 13

C-L-E-A-N

Read: Dean took a bath and felt fresh and clean. But when he lied to his friend, his heart felt heavy. He told the truth and said sorry. Now, his heart felt clean too. Dean learned a clean body is nice, but a clean heart—full of honesty, kindness, and love—is even more important to feel truly good.

Bible Verse: “Already you are clean because of the word that I have spoken to you.” (John 15:3)

Magnetic Word: On the fridge, find the letters to spell: C-L-E-A-N.

Prayer: Dear God, help my heart stay open and honest. Amen.

D-E-S-K



W-A-T-E-R



P-I-E



H-E-A-R-T



G-R-E-A-T



E-M-P-T-Y




